

## LEGO® City Planning (Age 5-8) or (Age 8-12)

Children work in a group to plan and build a city with essential infrastructure. They learn what is required to run a town or city, what services the city provides, and how certain services are strategically placed within the city. They then work on building their plan in order to discover what works and what doesn't.

The primary difference between the 5-8 and 8-12 classes are the type and level of instruction. Things are kept simpler for the younger age group with the older children will be asked to discuss and include more services. Instructors will participate in both classes but allow the older children to learn more through trial and error.
